

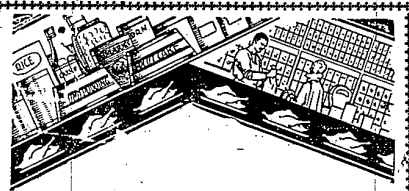
# Personal
