TRAPPERS NEED CONSENT
Lansing.—It is as necessary for a trapper to obtain the consent of the owner of property before he may set his traps as it is necessary to obtain the property owner's consent before one may hunt.

Trapping is considered as a "property interest" by the office of the Attorney General in a ruling made at the request of the Department of Conservation. The trapper is obligated to obtain consent of the property owner before he may operate.

In notifying trappers of the ruling of the Attorney General's office, the Law Enforcement Division of the Conservation Department reminded them that all trapping laws remain unchanged from last year.

Mr. Maddock had learned that a newly purchased tract of timber stumpage in the High Sierras, east of Fresno, would require rails instead of a skid road. 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**WANT NEW FORM
OF GOVERNMENT
FOR THE COUNTY**Propose Merging Departments
Eliminating The Board-Of
Supervisors

(Special to the Enterprise)
Pontiac.—A thorough and careful study of modern forms of government now operating successfully in various sections of the States, particularly governmental systems of counties peculiarly comparable to Oakland is being made by a committee of residents interested in a new governmental set-up for Oakland County.

A plan for a new governmental establishment in Oakland County would be submitted to the people through a referendum proposed by A. L. Moore, of Pontiac.

One plan would in effect be as follows:

Merging of the road and drain commissions and the county surveyor into a co-ordinated unit, with retention of the individual commissioners. This would result in the elimination of a large clerical force without impairing efficiency.

Abolition of the Board of Supervisors; creation of a Fiscal Court and a Sinking Fund; Merging of the Register of Deeds Office with the Sinking Fund.

Elimination of the Poor Commission and the setting up of the Community Chest plan for poor relief under the direction of the Associated Charities. The Fiscal Court could appropriate funds for extreme emergencies and county poor institutions.

Relieving the Sheriff's office from all duties at the County Jail, creation of the elective office of county jailer, with the matrons and guards appointive. No changes in the County Clerk's office.

It is claimed this plan, which, of course, has many other details, would effect a saving from 25 to 50 per cent in the cost of the county government.

BAZAAR PROFIT

A profit of \$116.76 was realized by the North Farmington Cemetery Auxiliary at its recent bazaar, about 170 attending and being served at dinner. With \$200 received from the Township, a total of \$316.76 was realized by the Auxiliary.

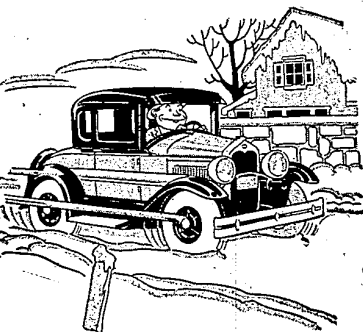
