AUTO INJURIES PROVE FATAL TO DR. W. DONALDSON

Prominent Commerce Physician Expires Thursday; Was Struck By Auto

Dr. W. J. Donaldson, 70 years old, of Commerce village died Thursday noon in City Hospital, Pontiac of injuries and shock he suffered when struck by a car which skidded on the icy pavement on Orchard Lake avenue, Tuesday morning.

He is survived by two sisters, Miss Emma Donaldson with whom he had been making his home in Commerce, and Mrs. Ida Smith of Pontiac. Dr. Donaldson was unmarried. He was formerly health officer.

Undersheriff Frank Greenan and Deputy Albert Ekstrom, who investigated the accident, reported Dr. Donaldson's car had gone into a ditch on Orchard Lake road near Telegraph. He was standing beside his car when Scott Lovejoy of Milford, approached driving east on Orchard Lake road.

Lovejoy's machine, according to officers, struck an icy rut and started to sway, the rear end striking Dr. Donaldson. Both cars were badly damaged.

Dr. Donaldson was former health officer of Commerce Township, and was one of the first physicians to practice in this section. It is said he had been ill for some time, and was recovering when the accident occurred.
