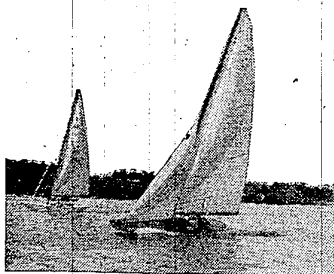
Board Of Review
