Annual School Report

District No. 8, Novi Township

Novi, Michigan, July 13th, 1931.

The annual school meeting was called to order by President Atkinson. First in order was the reading of the minutes of the last annual meeting, which were approved as read.

Treasurer Munro read his report of the financial condition of the district and on motion by Clark, supported by Brooks, it was accepted and approved.

Next in order was the reading of the budget for the ensuing year by the President.

On recommendation of the board, a motion by Moeren, supported by Burto Munro, that the money in the building fund be transferred to the general fund, carried.

Moved by W. D. Flint, supported by Burton Munro, that the District pay a maximum amount of \$60.00 per pupil for tuition instead of \$90.00 which had heretofore been paid. Considerable discussion followed, a request from Ford Brooks that a ballot vote be taken was granted. A total of 36 votes were cast, of which there were 23 NO, and 13 YES. Motion lost.

The election of two trustees for a full term of three years was now taken up, the President calling for nominations for one trustee. W. D. Flint and M. J. Moeren were nominated, ballots spread, when Mr. Flint arose and withdrew his nomination, and moved that the rules be suspended and the secretary be instructed to cast the entire ballot for Mr. Moeren, supported by Burton Munro. Carried.

Moved by Burton Munro, supported by Rev. Thompson, the nomination of C. E. Holmes for trustee. No further nominations being made and a motion was made, supported and carried that the rules be suspended and the secretary be instructed to cast the entire ballot for Mr. Holmes.

The question of the number of months school for the ensuing year was discussed, but no action taken.

No further business appearing, the meeting adjourned on motion made by Clark, supported by Martin.

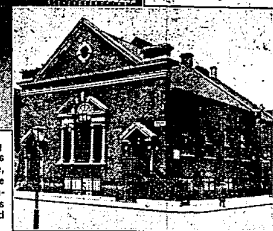

BRITISH GROUP PAYS
TRIBUTE TO DR. BELLScientific Organization Hangs
Portrait of Famed Inventor

A tribute to Alexander Graham

Bell as one of the great geniuses

of the electrical science and art

has been paid by the British Institution of Electrical Engineers, in

placing a portrait of him on the

walls of its auditorium in London.

The portrait is not merely a

recognition of Dr. Bell as the inventor

of the telephone, but rather as the

outstanding figure in the whole

field of his knowledge and use of

electricity. Accordingly, Dr. Bell

is represented not as a young man

of twenty-nine, when he invented

the telephone, but as a white-

haired and bearded man of years,

at the height of his career.

The portrait was presented to

the Institution by Sir Hugo Birt,

Bart, from the standpoint of paint-

ing, the problem of the portrait

was not a simple one, for only one

portrait of Dr. Bell had ever been

painted, and that did not represent

him in the period or character that

was appropriate for the purpose of

the British engineers. Therefore

it was necessary for the painter to

construct his portrait from a num-

ber of photographs, and gain his

understanding of Dr. Bell's char-

acter and temperament and manner

from biographical material. Every

assistance possible was given

by Dr. Bell's family and by Bell

System officials in this country.

The result has been a fine

achievement on the part of the

painter, Walter Westley Russell,

R. A., one of the best known present-

day British portrait painters. Mr.

Russell, since 1927, has had

charge with the title of Keeper of

the Royal Academy of the art col-

lections of that famous body of

painters and sculptors.

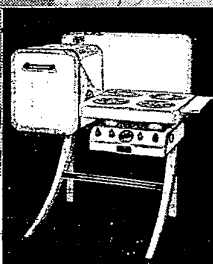
