

Annual School Report

District No. 9, Southfield Township

Annual meeting of Dist. No. 9, Southfield Township, Oakland County was held in the Southfield Community Hall Monday July 13th. Members present, Mrs. Tesch, Mr. Collins, Mr. Esler, Mr. Dowsett, Mr. Kennedy. Meeting called to order at 8:25 p. m.

Minutes of the last annual meeting were read. Motion made by Mr. H. R. Perry, supported by Mr. Wm. Ellis that minutes be accepted as read, motion carried.

Mr. Collins read the Sec. report of 1929 & 1930, covering the period between July 1st 1929 and June 30th 1930.

Motion made by Mr. John Johnson, supported by Mr. H. R. Perry that the report be approved as read, Motion carried.

Mr. Kennedy read the Sec. report covering the period from July 1st, 1930 to and including June 30, 1931.

Motion made Mr. John Johnson supported by Mr. H. Bondy that the report be approved as read, Motion carried.

Letter from Mrs. Eva V. Tesch, check for 12.00 dollars inclosed was read by the Sec. regarding refund of the above amount, which she received for aiding the Auditors.

Motion made by Mr. H. R. Perry supported by Mr. Yeager that check from Mrs. Tesch be accepted, Motion carried.

Mr. Yeager withdrew his motion, and Mr. Perry his support, and check was left entirely with the Board of Education.

Motion made by Mr. J. Hamill, supported by Mr. Bondy that the previous discussion be stricken from the meeting, Motion carried.

The question of the sale of the last bonds came up, and after a general discussion and a summary of the investigation made by Mr. Bushnell was given by Mr. Reed from Mr. Bushnell's office.

Motion made by Mr. J. Hamill, supported by Mr. James Davis that the discussion cease and go on with the regular business and elect the officers. Motion carried.

Motion made by Mrs. H. Kennedy, supported by Mrs. Tesch, that all voters be challenged, Motion carried.

President Dowsett appointed as challengers Mr. J. Hamill and Mr. Asam. Mr. Asam refused to act and Mr. Hamill was the only challenger.

President Dowsett appointed Tellers, Mr. A. Bentley, Mr. Garden, Mr. Gridley, all acting.

Nominations were open for member of the Board for a term of three years. Mrs. Eva Tesch nominated by Mr. J. Kosciolek, supported by Mrs. H. Holbrook.

Mr. Frank Lewis nominated by Mr. John Johnson, supported by Mrs. L. Dowsett. Motion made by Mrs. H. Kennedy supported by Mr. Rodenhouse that nominations close. Motion carried.
