Lansing, Mich.—Officials of 14 states have accepted the invitation of Secretary of State Frank D. Fitzgerald to attend a conference on reciprocal motor vehicle law enforcement to be held in Detroit on September 18.

The Secretary of State is directed by a resolution of the last legislature "to confer with the jurisdictional bodies of neighboring states toward a fair plan of reciprocity in the enforcement of motor vehicle laws of the various states in respect to their application to the owners and operators of motor vehicles going from one state to another and, to lend every effort toward providing a plan of uniformity of motor vehicle legislation with the neighboring states and to report any tentative plan to the 1932 legislature for its consideration."

The first conference was held in French Lick, Ind., and the subject of truck license legislation was discussed. The Detroit meeting will consider the question of uniform weight tax fees. New York and Pennsylvania, which did not attend the first meeting, have accepted invitations.
