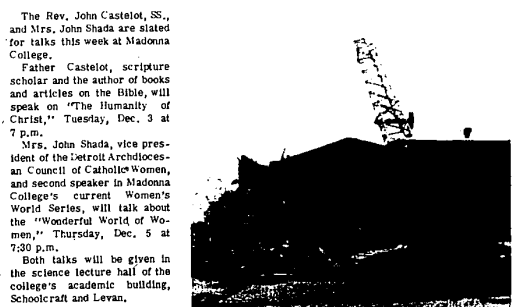
2 Madonna Talks Are Set

St. Valentine Altar Society members have been busy for months preparing for their annual Christmas Fair, Sunday, Dec. 1, from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. The proceeds from this event will aid in furnishing their Dream Kitchen to be contained in the new building.

Mrs. Betty Patrick, altar society president, and Mrs. Marge Carson, fair chairman, said the fair will feature hand-made Christmas gifts and novelties, a bake sale, games and prizes. Santa Claus will be there to talk and treat the young set, and refreshments will be available. St. Valentine's school building, located at Beech Daly and Dow, five blocks south of Five Mile in Redford Township, will be festively decorated for the event.

Service Of Organization Planned In Ward Church

The chapel at Six Mile and Farmington Road, Livonia, and the Presbyterian congregation that has been worshipping there for more than eight years become a separate church service at 7 p.m. Sunday, Dec. 1. A special service organization will officially recognize Ward United Presbyterian Church as a separate entity. Up to now, it has been an "outreach" church of Ward Memorial Presbyterian Church, Detroit.

Unusual in modern Presbyterian history, it will be organized with a charter membership of 1,100, church school enrollment of 1,000 and a 1968 budget of nearly \$150,000 for missions, operating and building fund expenses.

THE SERVICE of organization will include receiving charter members, and nomination, election and installation of Dr. Bartlett L. Hess as minister.

In addition, there will be election, ordination and installation of elders and deacons. Dr. Hess, who formerly worked with both the Detroit and the outreach church and now becomes full-time minister of the Livonia congregation, will deliver a sermon entitled "What Makes a Church?"

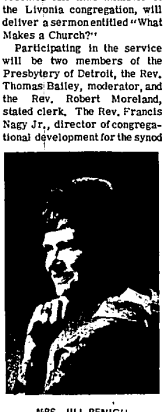
Participating in the service will be two members of the Presbytery of Detroit, the Rev. Thomas Bailey, moderator, and the Rev. Robert Moreland, stated clerk. The Rev. Francis Nag Jr., director of congregational development for the synod of Michigan, also will take part. A reception honoring Dr. and Mrs. Hess will follow the service.

THE LIVONIA congregation held its first service in the Lincoln school in May 1956, with Dr. Hess in charge. The session and board of trustees, in cooperation with the Presbytery of Detroit, bought eight acres of land at Farmington Road and Six Mile a month later.

The chapel unit was dedicated in May 1960, and at that time the Livonia membership was 150 and the Bible school had about the same number of students. Membership grew, however, and in February of 1965 the Christian Education wings were dedicated.

Further building on the site is planned in the future.

DR. HESS has become one of the best-known clergymen in the area. Born in Spokane, Wash., he holds degrees from Park College, Mo., the University of Kansas and McCormick Theological Seminary, Chicago. He served parishes in Chicago and Cleveland.

Antioch Women Hear Mrs. Renich

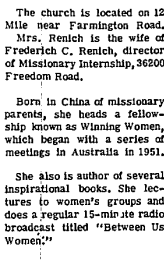
