Consumer Comment Invited On Paprika

The U.S. Department of Agri-culture has extended to Dec. 7 the deadline for filing com-ments on its proposal to pro-hibit use of paprika in certain resh meats and meat products. The proposal, originally made Oct, 8, would amend fed-eral meat inspection reg-ulations to prohibit use of paprika in fresh meat and fresh meat products except chorizo sausages and Italian sausages.

meat products except cnorus sausages and italian kypes sausages. The extension of the original deadline, Nov. 7, was requested by members of the packing industry to permit them more time to evaluate the proposal.
