Choice Lies Between Black Yellow And Blue-White

Lansing, Mich. Jan. 19—Final decision regarding the color combination of the 1933 motor vehicle license plates, is to be made soon by the Department of State. Two combinations are being considered at the present time.

The first calls for black numerals on yellow background. The second palls for blue numerals on a white background, a reverse of the colors of the 1932 plates. Within the heart few weeks, a decision also will be made regarding the use of [Bitchigan-mined copper in the next year's plates.
