City's Tax Rate Is Cut; Discount For Early Paying

Rate Reduced \$2 Per Thousand Below 1931 Figure; New Payment Feature

ment Feature City of Farmington's tax rate for 1932 will be \$2 per thousand less than in 1931, being set at \$16 by the Commission Monday night. This is \$1 lower than the 1930 rate, which was \$16. The budget as proposed by the board of estimate and as outlined in the Enterprise two weeks ago, was adopted by the Commission with one minor change. The total, however, was not altered, the change being a shift of \$1,000 from one fund to another. In order to encourage payment of taxes, and also in fairness to those who pay their taxes early and then feel that thay are at a disadvantage compared to others. and paying until later, the Com-mission adopted a new discount plan. Instead of having a no-pen-alty period until August 1, which has always been extended a month, there will be a premium for payment during July. A dis-count of 2 per cent will be al-lowed for payment in that month.
