'Service With Love' Is New Information Depot

"Service With Love" is a name you'll want to remember if you need an emergency sitter, or if your child swallows something poisonous, or if you learn a member of the family is taking drugs.

Or if you find yourself in the middle of countless other emergencies of daily living. You know there are agencies that can help, but which one, and how do you reach the assistance you need.

"Service With Love" is designed to bring together information on the various agencies available to give assistance, according to a Farmington woman who is co-chairman of the ambitious project that began Nov. 8.

"IT'S A SIMPLE idea, really," explained Mrs. William P. Greenberg. "We want to make it easier for people who need help to find the person or the agency that can provide the help."

Organized through the Community Action Committee of the Southeast District Michigan Association of Hospital Auxiliaries, the service provides four telephone numbers to give residents of the entire Detroit metropolitan area toll-free access to information.

These numbers are: Wayne County residents is 272-6150, and for Oakland County is 338-0359.

These will be manned by volunteer workers from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. daily. At other hours, callers will be directed to Community Information Service, open 24 hours a day.

The four "Service With Love" information centers are being staffed by volunteers from Sinai Hospital in Detroit, Pontiac General, Outer Drive Hospital in Lincoln Park and St. Joseph Hospital in Mt. Clemens.

MRS. GREENBERG noted that in addition to the hospitals, a large number of health care agencies, including United Community Services, Social Security Administration, Red Cross, Wayne County Department of Social Services, and numerous other organizations are participating in the project.

"We hope that public acceptance and use of these pilot 'Service With Love' information centers will eventually result in more centers being opened," Mrs. Greenberg said. "We know that there are many persons who need help but are unaware of services that are available to them."

The "Service With Love" centers will provide a telephone information and referral service on a five-day-a-week basis in the beginning. Persons with health care questions may call the center in their area or any of the four centers.

Evelyn M. Fraser, associate executive in charge of the UCS-sponsored, Community Information Service, commented that the "Service With Love" project dovetailed neatly with the information program which she supervises.

The classes focus on the explanation of labor and birth, neuro-muscular control and effective breathing techniques which enable a mother to be awake, aware and participating in the birth of her child.
