## Leaders Visit McDonald

FARMINGTON Government leaders and businessmen from the Farmington area recently spent a day in Washington, D.C., to hear briefings from federal officials.

Phase one, said Ford, House minority leader, who outlined what might happen in Phase Two of the economic controls which he said has been very successful in controlling inflation. Solid waste disposal, drugs, police actions and agreements with foreign countries on these matters were discussed, along with the problems of phosphates in the Great Lakes and air pollution. Tax relief for business men who cooperate in pollution control, and smoking were also topics covered in the day long program.
