

RU Marches Over Belleville; Finishes 2nd In Suburban '8'

Redford Union bounced back to its winning ways in a 28-15 Dad's Night victory over Belleville. The Panthers concluded Suburban Eight play with a 6-1 record, one half game off the pace by Allen Park who edged wireless Trenton in a 14-13 scramble to finish at 6-1.

A 55-yard field goal by Trenton in the first half kept the Panthers remaining in the game sailed wide and RU's hopes of a crown vanished for at least one year.

THE PANTHERS marched 52 yards the first time they had the ball with Jim Shay lighting for 30 and Tom Tullock going over from the one. Bill Humphrey converted and RU was up 7-0.

RU marched back later in the quarter on a punt return of 45 yards by Luvo Bravo to the Belleville 11 yard line. It took

Shay two plays to score on runs of seven and four yards and Glenn Richmond connected with Scott Bjerke for a two-pointer to put RU up 15-0.

Midway through the second, Richmond connected with Bjerke again but this time it was for 31 yards and a six-pointer. Humphrey converted and RU was ahead 21-0 at the half with Belleville not penetrating the Panther 40.

The Belleville Tigers came out of the locker room the second half looking like a different team; marching 62 yards the first time they had the ball with Mike Dansard scoring from the one and Mike Garland converting a two-pointer to cut the lead to 21-8.

Belleville controlled the ball during the third quarter for all but seven plays and scored early in the fourth on a six-yard pass from Garland to Charlie Pate climaxing a 65-yard drive. Pate converted and the RU lead was down to 21-15 with five minutes remaining.

Shay gave RU breathing room as he returned the next kickoff 92 yards for a touchdown with some key blocks by Tollock and Jerry Petsch.

Humphrey converted and RU had upped its lead to 28-15.

JUNIOR TAILBACK SHAY (Tom Burk's replacement) was the game's leading ground gainer with 81 yards in 16 carries. Tullock was next with 61 yards in 14 carries.

"The difference in the ballgame was my specialty teams," said RU Coach Bob Atkins. "The kickoff and punting squads won the game for us. "Pete averaged 40.4 yards punting," added Atkins. "He kept Belleville in the hole throughout most of the game."

Statistically the game was almost a toss-up with RU totaling 215 yards to Belleville's 212. Richmond was two for seven while Garland went six for 15.

RU in winning its seventh game this season has now won more games in one year than any other Panther football squad. They take on Thurston Saturday afternoon in the season's finale.

Stevenson jumped to a 7-0 lead with Dale Haterman hitting Chris Centers on a 25-yard scoring play. Neil Bowly converted and the Spartans enjoyed the lead but the Eagles came right back on a 69-yard scoring pass from Graustein to Gary Chappell. A two-pointer failed and the Spartans will lead 7-6.

JEFF SMRTKA recovered a fumble for Thurston on the Stevenson 24 and Graustein completed the short drive with a one-yard plunge.

Graustein ran the two-point play over and Thurston led 14-7.

Spartan Bob Biaty recovered a Thurston fumble on the Eagle 10 and Haberman tossed to Kim Simon for a touchdown on the turnover drive. Bowly converted and the score stood deadlocked at 14-14.

Graustein then proceeded to connect on his aerial assault. He connected with Scott Irwin on an 80-yard TD romp and with Mark Miller on a six-yard screen pass play.

Graustein ran for both extra points and Thurston led at the half 30-14.

MILLER hauled in another Graustein TD pass in the third quarter totaling 23 yards with Bob Ghanann catching a two-pointer from Graustein to up the lead to 38-14.

Stevenson tackle Chuck Shipley halted another Thurston scoring drive as he scored himself on a 76-yard pass interception return. The point after was blocked and the scoreboard read 38-20.

Thurston tallied twice in the final quarter on a 24-yard TD pass from Graustein to Irwin and 15-yard TD pass from Graustein to Chappell.

Thurston totaled 415 yards in the 52-20 rout.

Graustein Throws 6 TDs

Thurston's "iron mike" Bob Graustein passed for six touchdowns to pace the Eagles to a 52-0 win over Stevenson. Graustein added a touch-

down on a one-yard sneak, conversions and ran for three two-pointers to sparkle his one-man showing of 17 for 33

passes compiling 352 yards. He has tossed 15 touchdowns this season totaling 1,359 yards in the air with a Redford Union clash on tap
