Margolius To Speak At WSU

Sidney Margolius will discuss "The Last Lamb in the Consumer Maze" at Wayne State University's Consumer Colloquium Wednesday, Nov. 17.

The colloquium, sponsored by the department of family and consumer resources, will be held in the lower DeRoy Auditorium.

Margolius will deliver his speech at 3:30 p.m. In addition to writing 12 consumer books, Margolius has written more than 250 articles for consumer magazines. He serves as a consultant for government consumer organizations and was a member of the National Commission for Product Safety.

The colloquium will also feature a "Concern-In" for students from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. in the University Center ballroom. Representatives of various groups including the Better Business Bureau, the Food and Drug Administration, Legal Aid Clinic and the Consumer Research Advisory Council will set up exhibits and hold short seminars to educate students on current consumer concerns.

Dianne McKaig, executive director of the Michigan Consumer Council, will speak at 12 noon.

The colloquium is free to students and faculty of WSU and open to the public for a \$2 participation fee.

Nominations Due Soon

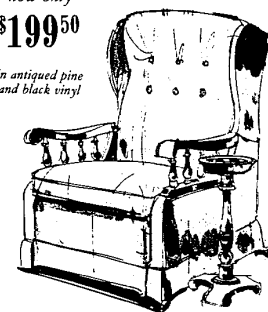
