Township Welfare Is Costing \$320 A Week

adopted a resolution providing for repayment of the first loan of \$150 in five annual installments, \$30 on July 1, 1934 and the same amount on the same date in each year thereafter through 1938. The resolution, adopted by the City, however, failed to include a clause pledging welfare tax collections to insure repayment of the loan, and also authorizing use of any other city money in case sufficient welfare money was not collected.

Township Board members felt that although there would be no question of the City's paying the loan, that the City's resolution should contain the same pledge the Township was forced to make in obtaining its two loans of \$5,000, which includes the \$300 for the City. Action on a motion approving the City's resolution was deferred until the pledge clause would be inserted by the City. In the transaction the Township merely acts as agent for the City because State officials did not wish to have numerous small loans in amounts of a few hundred dollars, but the Township is held responsible for payment to Reconstruction Corporation of the City's portion of the loan as well as its own.
