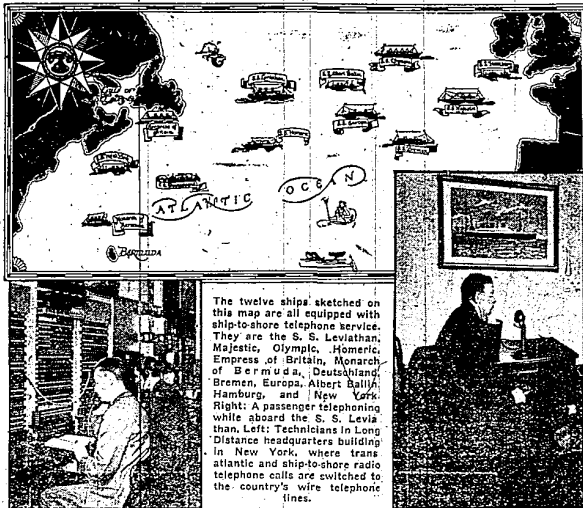

## Passengers on Dozen Ocean Liners Can Talk with Land while in Mid Ocean

During the past summer, the number of transatlantic liners having radio telephone service with North American points while the vessels are at sea has doubled. The addition of six vessels of the North German Lloyd and the Hamburg American lines brings the fleet of liners so equipped to a round dozen. As in the case of the first ships already included in the ship-to-shore service, the newly added vessels reach the Bell System land telephone lines through the radio telephone stations of the American Telephone and Telegraph Company at New York, N. Y., and Ocean Gate, N. J.

Can Reach All Bell Telephone. The vessel while at sea is able to reach all Bell telephone, as well as those connecting with the system in the United States, Canada, Mexico, and Cuba. Through ship-to-shore telephone service, in Europe, the lines may have conversations with points in the United States and the continent of Europe.

The first of the vessels to be recently included in the service was the S. S. Deutschland, which was added to the telephone-equipped fleet early in May. On June 7 the Bremen was added to the list, followed within a few days by its sister ship, the Europa. During the next four weeks the Steamships Albert Ballin, Hamburg, and New York were included in the service in the order named.

Voices Switched to Land Lines. The apparatus on all six of these liners is owned and operated by D. E. B. E. G., the German radio operating company. A voice spoken into a special ship-to-shore telephone on any of the vessels while en route to or from this country speeds by short wave radio to the Farfield River receiving station of the Bell Telephone Company. Here the radio waves are demodulated and the voice waves pass over wires and cables to the control room in the new Long Distance Building at 32 Sixth Avenue, New York. At this point the ship-to-shore operator

routes the call over the appropriate long distance line to its destination. The answering voice follows the same route back through the Long Distance Building in New York City, thence traveling over land wires and cables to the ship-to-shore transmitting station at Ocean Gate, N. J. There, by means of directional antenna aimed at the ship's course, the voice is dispatched by short wave radio to the liner as it ploughs through the waters of the North Atlantic.

### Service Was Begun in 1929

The first vessel to be equipped for regular commercial ship-to-shore telephone service was the Leviathan, which service was extended on December 8, 1929. The following Spring the service was extended to the Majestic, Olympic, and Homeric of the White Star Lines. Last year, service was opened with the Empress of Britain of the Canadian Pacific Line, and the Monarch of Bermuda of the Bermuda Line.
