Our present municipal judge, JOHN J. SCHULTE, Jr., has had almost 100 appeals taken from his court, with ONLY ONE REVERSAL—and that in a jury case in which the point of reversal was one of fact rather than of law.

WE NEED AN ATTORNEY in our municipal court, both in justice to the parties in the cases tried and to avoid numerous appeals of cases, since appeals would be more probable if attorneys knew that the justice hearing the case had not had legal training. WE WANT Judge John J. Schulle, Jr., to continue as our municipal judge because of his splendid record on the bench.


