WHEREAS, The Army of the United States, for more than a century and a half, has performed heroically and splendidly, in peace and war; and
WHEREAS, The State of Michigan and this community have contributed to the men who have so served with honor to their country; their state, their neighborhood and themselves; and
WHEREAS, Thursday, April sixth, has been designated as Army Day, in commemoration of the services of the Army; and
