Organize For Coming Year**

Troop 45 of Farmington Boy Scouts of America was re-organized under the present head in the fall of 1931. The old charter which was in effect at that time expired on March 31, 1932. Seventeen scouts were then registered. During the past year seven boys were taken in and six left the troop, two of whom were transferred to Detroit. For March 31 of this year eighteen scouts or 100% of the troop were registered. Fourteen of these are in uniforms and the fifteenth is ready to get his suit as soon as he gets his registration card as a new scout. This percentage is bettered by few troops in the country.

The average attendance of scouts paying dues of five cents promptly each weekly meeting is ten and four tenths. Average attendance of scouts registered at dues is about fifteen.

Receipts for the year amounted to \$24.19, while expenses were \$6.66. From the balance of \$17.53, \$9.00 was advanced for registration to avoid delay and get the ten extra points given for registering ahead of time. Mr. Watson, executive of the Council at Pontiac has informed the scoutmaster that the registration of Troop 45 is the only one out of four to come in ahead of time.

Considerable interest is shown on the part of boys approaching the entrance qualifications of twelve years of age and even more two new scouts have entered and will be officially joined as soon as they get their tenderfoot requirements passed. This will bring the registration to twenty.

The sponsoring organization is a

group of thoughtful men headed by Mr. Howard Warner as chairman and supported by Mr. William Way, Mr. James Smith and Mr. Joseph Himmelspach, who in addition to being a committeeman of considerable worth is District commissioner of this section of the county. These men together with the scoutmaster and assistant scoutmaster have re-registered at one dollar apiece and again pledged their support to the troop for the coming year.

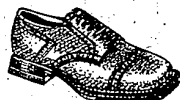
