Waterless Pot Roast
 3 pounds Rolled Beef Roast
 1 Onion, Sliced 1 tablespoon Lard
 3 Carrots, Sliced 1 teaspoon Salt
 Preheat the casserole 15 minutes on high heat. Place the meat in the hot roaster; then lower the heat to low on one side. Turn the meat and brown 5 hours on evened side. Now remove the meat and place the onion and carrots on the bottom of the roaster. Replace the meat and continue on high heat until steaming is again noticed, then change to low heat and cook until tender. Before serving, remove the roast and vegetables; then add 2 cups of boiling water and salt to taste. Thicken with this paste of flour in cup of cold water.

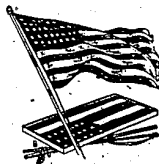
