

Will Give Vets Share In Reforestation Work

Word has been received that selection of the World War Veterans' quota of 25,000 men for reforestation work will begin in all sections of the country soon.

Under the terms of the selection program, the details of which will be announced shortly, the Veterans Administration will be charged with the task of selecting the veterans and sending them to Army conditioning camps for enrollment in the Civilian Conservation Corps.

Veterans seeking a place in the Civilian Conservation Corps can, if they desire, go at once to the Regional Office of the Veterans Administration in their state and have their names placed on a tentative register for consideration at such time as the official selection for enrollment begins.

In advance of the call for men

to fill the veterans quotas, the managers of all regional offices of the Veterans Administration have been instructed to establish such tentative registers and take the names of applicants. The Veterans who are ready to apply in person, when enrollment at the various veterans administration regional offices is called for will stand the best chance of getting into the forest camps, it is reported.

The workers of the Baptist Church will conduct a daily Bible school for the boys and girls of the community.

The school will be divided into three departments with trained leaders in each department. All boys and girls 4 to 14 years are welcome.

FOX'S 'CAVALCADE' AT GREAT LAKES SUN. MON., TUES.



The long-awaited Fox Film production of Noel Coward's "Cavalcade" will make its local at the Great Lakes Theatre Sunday, Monday and Tuesday.

Frank Lloyd, who directed, spent more than six months in preparation with a large technical staff before filming one scene, and every detail is authentic in every particular. He scoured the world for the most suitable players for the various roles, gathering an all-star cast which includes Diana Wynyard, Olive Brook, Beryl Mercer, Herbert Mundin, Una O'Connor, Irene Brown, Frank Lawton and Merle Totten.

The Misses O'Connor, Brown and Tottenham were members of the Drury Lane cast of "Cavalcade," and were brought to Hollywood to re-enact the roles they created on the stage.

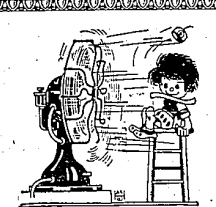

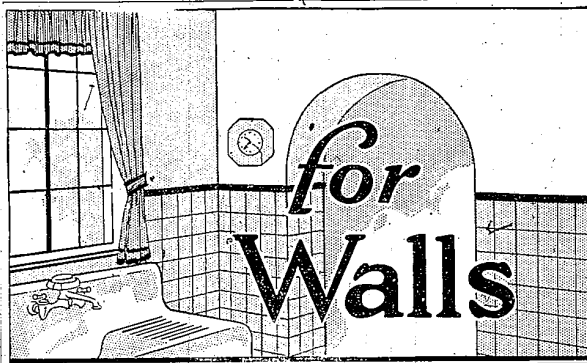
