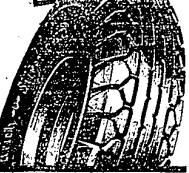

Roy Plumton, Delos Hamlin and his father-in-law, and Harrison Johnson attended the races at the State Fair grounds Thursday.

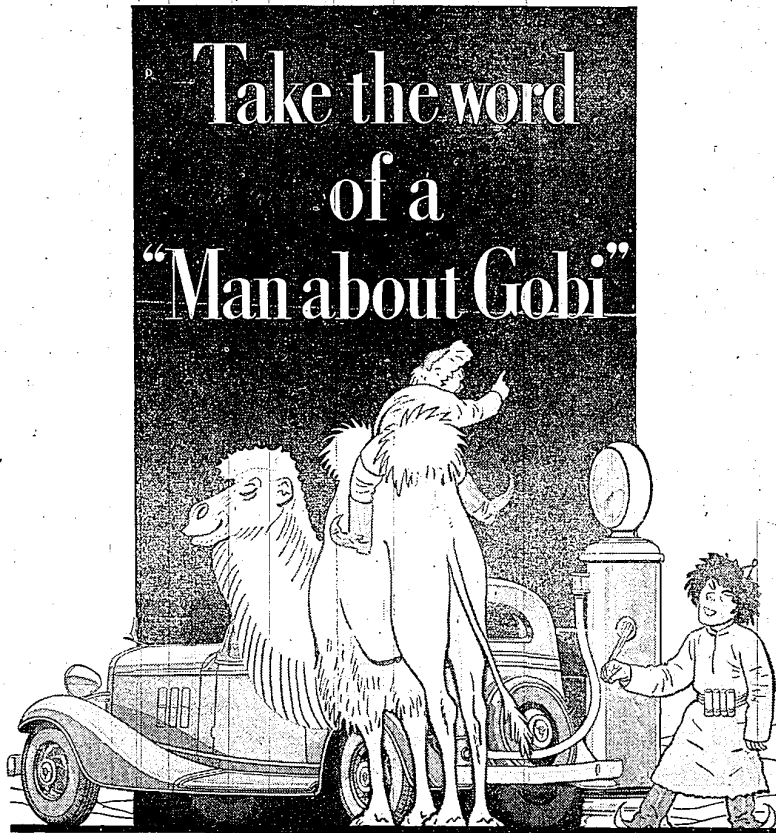
