**FIRST NIGHT AUTO  
 RACING IN STATE  
 ON FRIDAY NIGHT**

Ann Arbor, Mich., Sept. 28—The first night auto racing in Michigan will be held on the half mile track at the fair grounds here Friday night, Sept. 29th, starting at 8 o'clock. The fair association has the only night lighted track in the state. The races will be sanctioned by the A. A. A. and the drivers will be from Indianapolis, California, Detroit, Chicago, and through the east. Most of the pilots are former drivers at the Indianapolis 500 mile auto race so the character of the show can be imagined.

For the race Friday night the Michigan Speedway Association has been chosen to conduct the event. As an indication of the character of the race let it be known that W. D. Edburn, of Detroit who each year runs the big 500 mile race at Indianapolis and who is in charge of the Harnsworth boat races will be here to conduct the auto races.

In addition to 50 miles of racing, which will be featured by the presence of the two seater type of race car as well as the single seater, there will be a special stock car race for stripped cars in the low price field. For this event the No. 10 Ford V-8 in which Fred Frame won at Elgin three weeks ago has already been entered.

In California where night auto racing has brought out tremendous crowds spectators are thrilled by the spectacle.

The Ann Arbor night plant was built under instruction from U. of M. engineers. Another added feature will be the presence at the race of the entire U. of M. football squad this year.

The price of admission has been placed at 65 cents and a crowd of 10,000 is expected. The gates will open at 6 o'clock. The first race starts at 8 o'clock.

**KEEP LAMBS GAINING  
 TO GET BEST PRICES**

Market-topping lambs are the ones that carry to market their original fat and that is most easily retained by animals, which have been weaned and fed rations which will keep them continuously gaining, according to the animal husbandry department at Michigan State College.

Lambs weaned at 3 1/2 months and self fed oats on second growth alfalfa pasture gained rapidly enough to earn their owner, Charles Covell, Elwell the title of champion Michigan flockmaster. Barley is substituted for oats, by Mr. Covell, after the lambs have become accustomed to the grain.

**MANY INQUIRIES**

Lansing, Public interest in lake and stream improvement to provide better fishing is being indicated according to the Department of Conservation, by the large number of inquiries that are being received concerning the recently announced plans to utilize Emergency Conservation Work labor.

Under the plan, which has the approval of the federal government, in instances where all property owners along a considerable stretch of stream or lake shore indicate their willingness, and when the waters are open to the public for fishing, C. C. C. workers will be placed on stream improvement projects.

 LIVES OF WHOLE FAMILY**

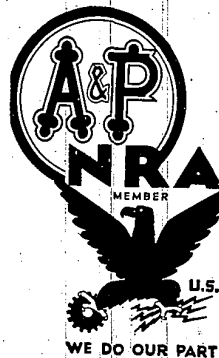

Alarmed, he motored to her home and reaching her so early to the bell, climbed in a window. Smelling gas, he rushed to the bedrooms, where he found his mother, his sister, and her husband, all unconscious. The family had had breakfast, and finding the house cold, had lit an oil stove and the gas range, and then gone back to bed. With all windows closed, the fumes overcame them while they slept. The daughter and son-in-law were revived by an emergency squad, but the mother's condition necessitated her removal to a hospital.

**FAMILY RESCUED FROM DEATH BY CARBON MONOXIDE GAS**  
 Franklin, Pa., of all instances, Wis., rescued himself from a coma into which he was passing, one morning not long ago, and found carbon monoxide gas was seeping from a coal heater. His wife, two young sons, and his wife's sister were already overcome. Crawling to the telephone, he managed to call the fire department before he collapsed. A rescue squad found all five members of the family unconscious, but at the suggestion of artificial respiration succeeded in restoring them.
