The timber of the lofty tavola in the Fiji Islands is used largely for making native drums which when played can be heard at great distances.

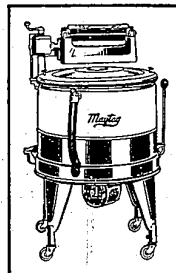

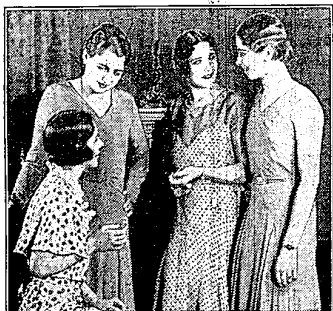
