Miss Estelle McGraw recently retired from the employ of the Michigan Bell Telephone Company with the longest record of telephone service ever attained by a Michigan woman. She became an operator on July 6, 1887, when Detroit had only two telephone girls, and she was the youngest of the two.

At that time, only 1,700 persons in the city had telephones, and during those early years her experience included local and long distance operating, collections, waiting on customers at the counter, and making herself generally useful. For the past 30 years she had filled an important place in the Michigan Bell Telephone Company's telephone department, and for ten years had been in charge of the compilation of all of the company's telephone directories except the Detroit book.

First, thing she did upon her retirement was to go to Northern Michigan on a trout fishing trip.

ENOUGH WIRE TO GO ROUND  
THE WORLD 6,000 TIMES

There was a total of 88,100,000 miles of telephone wire in the United States and 2,280,000 miles of telegraph wire on January 1, 1932, the latest date for which comparable figures are available.

In fact, the telephone wire mileage in the United States is forty-three times the amount of miles of telegraph wire in the United States and a little more than twice as much as there is in all of Europe. It represents 53 per cent of the total telephone wire mileage of the world. The telegraph wire in the United States represents 84 per cent of the world's total.

The total number of miles of telephone wire in the world figures up to 145,392,500, and of telegraph wire, 6,773,500 miles.
