### A NEW TYPE OF REFRIGERATOR TO BE OFFERED HERE

The increasing national interest in gas refrigeration as an aid in making kitchen work easier reached Farmington today with the announcement that the Consumers Power Company of this State had been granted sales rights in this vicinity for the new air-cooled Electrolux refrigerator, the latest scientific advance in gas refrigeration.

Awarding of the franchise to merchandise Electrolux refrigerators in the neighborhood of Farmington was announced by F. E. Sellman, vice-president of Electrolux Refrigerator Sales, Inc., from its eastern headquarters, 51 East 42nd Street, New York City. Designation of the Consumers Power Company as a distributor of gas refrigerators in this section is part of the "new deal" expansion policy of Electrolux.

Under its contract, the distributor has also been granted Electrolux refrigerator for thirty-two other Michigan cities.

The refrigerators are manufactured by Servel, Inc., at Evansville, Indiana, and have been sold extensively throughout the United States for several years. American gas companies usually acting as the distributors. The gas refrigerators now being marketed by Electrolux Refrigerator Sales, Inc., a subsidiary of the Servel company are air cooled, a new type which was introduced in many sections of the country in April of the present year.

The Electrolux gas refrigerator is based on Swedish patents which were taken over by Servel, Inc., about seven years ago. Many improvements have been made since then through extensive tests and much scientific research in the company's laboratories in Evansville and New York.

The Electrolux refrigerator is built without moving parts and so is absolutely noiseless. It is simply constructed so as to require a minimum of attention. Due to the elimination of machinery, there is no friction, vibration, and no wear and tear.

The refrigerants are circulated by means of a tiny flame of illuminating gas, the flame being protected by an automatic shutoff. The cost of operation is low due to the relatively small amount of gas used. In most of the localities where the refrigerator has been introduced the cost amounts to only a few cents a day.

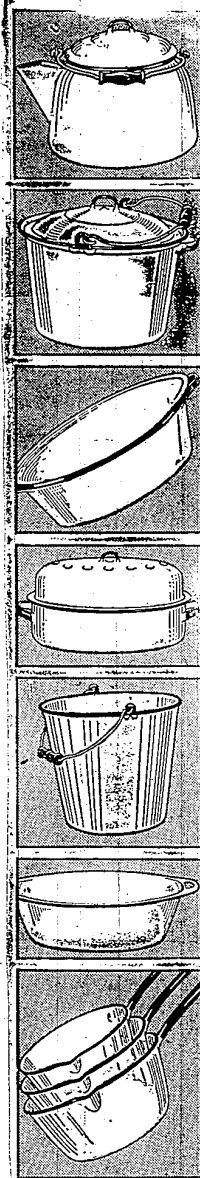
The County has been financially unable to furnish them, so the deputies have taken the matter in hand themselves. A handsome prize will be given away at the dance.

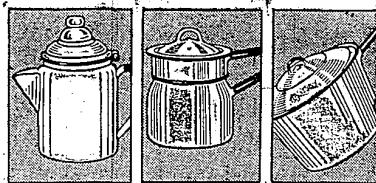

### Violet Rays Detect Seeds

Violet rays are now used to protect the American farmer, but the rays are used on grass seeds—not the farmer. The rays, used in an almost unvarying test, make Italian ryegrass, sometimes sold as English ryegrass, reveal its true identity. When the seeds are germinated on filter paper and put in a darkened chamber and the short rays played upon them, the paper on which the roots of the Italian variety lie at once betray the seed by giving off a distinct, ghostlike glow. Even more mystifying, the apparently identical seeds of the English variety, when tested side by side with the Italian, fail to react. Some seeds of the two varieties are otherwise indistinguishable, but the English variety usually brings a higher price. The discovery that short rays would make the filter paper fluoresce on which the roots of certain plants grow was made in Germany, and the Department of Agriculture has adopted it to protect American farmers in buying seed.

### Replant Windbreaks

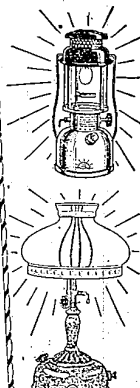
Farm windbreaks in the prairie regions have suffered severely from heavy cuttings for fuel wood during the last year, according to reports to the United States forest service. State officials report that on some farms as much as \$100 worth of wood was removed, relieving the farmer of buying other fuel. But wholesale cutting has left many farms and farm buildings exposed to the winds, and more planting will be needed to replace the trees lost from pioneer plantings. Some farmers are raising their own seedlings.
