tice ended Wednesday afternoon, farmers or anyone interested are allowed a week to file with the Washington officials any information or arguments they wish, that have bearing on the questions considered at Pontiac. Until midnight of March 15, the Department of Agriculture will receive material of this kind. Matter not presented at the hearing will be accepted, or if it is desired to file briefs consolidating points brought out at the hearing, such may be done. Such material must be in the form of five typewritten copies.

At the conclusion of the hearing, which ended in a tame fashion and in the presence of much smaller audience than attended the Monday and Tuesday sessions, there was no announcement of future procedure by the Government. However, informed observers predicted that the results of the hearing would be a decision by the Government that licensing is necessary in the Detroit milkshed, and that a market director should be appointed, representing the Government and having full charge of regulating everything which would be the final authority. These observers expressed the opinion that the license would be issued to the Michigan Milk Producers Association as the organization representative of the farmer, but the appointment of a market director would leave the Producers Association with few of its functions. These would be all absorbed, it was forecast, by the market director if one is appointed, and the Association would be licensee in name only, with the Government official the active director of all dairy industry affairs in the Detroit area.

It is expected that ruling on the license will follow shortly after March 15. Delay in putting the increase of 10 cents per cwt. in effect is said to be costing the farmers of the Detroit milkshed 2,000 per day.

Reports in the daily press of "rioting" have characterized as gross exaggerations by farmers of this section. One farmer was ejected Monday after failure to comply with twice-stated rules of the hearing.
