Pictures can be mailed back only if an addressed and stamped envelope is supplied. They also may be picked up at the office at 26251 Schoolcraft after publication.

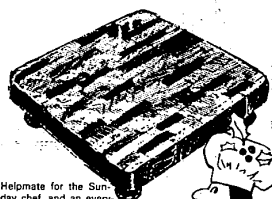
