End of CWA, Details Of New Program Told

The new contemplated plan is similar to the old plan of work, relief with the exception that there will not be a flat rate feature but every man working will be rated in accordance with the type of work that he is doing. A schedule of rates has been prepared and certified by a special committee of the township.

All materials, and in some instances, supervision, must be furnished by the communities or political subdivision which propose the project.

The maximum hours of labor is set at 24 per week.

Work wage project rates shall be that prevailing in the community for the occupation. The minimum shall be 30c per hour.

The prevailing rate shall be determined by a committee selected in accordance with State regulations.

Trucks shall be considered as material, however, the driver could be considered as a wage worker if he meets the needs test.

The Work Wage program apparently one that is to continue indefinitely.

Relative to Opening and Closing of the Polls

Public Acts 1929—No. 306, Chapter VIII

Section 1. On the day of any election the polls shall be opened at seven o'clock in the forenoon, and shall be continued open until six o'clock in the afternoon and no longer: PROVIDED, That in Townships the board of inspectors of election may at its discretion adjourn the polls at one o'clock noon, for one hour, and that the township board in townships and the legislative body in cities and villages may by resolution provide that the polls shall be opened at six o'clock in the forenoon and may also provide that the polls shall be kept open not later than eight o'clock in the evening of the same day. Every qualified elector present and in line at the polls at the hour prescribed for the closing thereof shall be allowed to vote.

The Polls of said election will be open at 7 o'clock a. m. and will remain open until 8 o'clock p. m. Eastern Standard Time, of said day of election. The polls will adjourn at 1:00 o'clock for one hour for the Annual Township business meeting.
