Motion made by Hatton, seconded by Gildemeister that the City Commission of Farmington move the approval of a State retail wine store in the plant of the LaSalle Wine and Champagne company incorporated at Farmington, Michigan. All Yeas.

Motion made by Hamlin, seconded by Staman that we charge the LaSalle Wine and Champagne Co. \$25.00 a quarter for 4th year for water. Carried. All yeas.

Moved by Staman, seconded by Hamlin that Ed Thayer be appointed Fire Chief and Harold Oldenburgh, assistant. Carried.

Motion made by Staman, seconded by Oldenburgh that the members of the election board be paid \$5.00 for their work. Carried.

Motion made by Hamlin, seconded by Hatton, that Tuesday and

Wednesday, May 8 and 9 be named as clean up days. Carried.

Motion made by Gildemeister, seconded by Oldenburgh that the City buy a car load of road oil. Carried.

Mrs. Isaac Way of Blenheim, Ont. returned home Sunday after

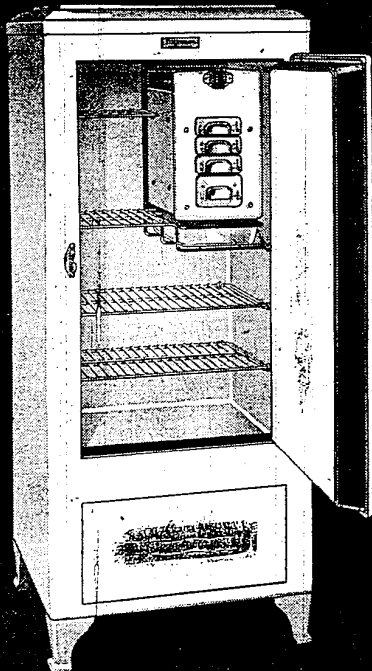
a month's visit with her two sons and their families; Mr. and Mrs. Gordon Way, and Mr. and Mrs. Edward Way.
