Miss Mary Kocis, 21 years old, 2169 Morrell street, Detroit, drowned early Saturday morning while in bathing at Walled Lake. The girl and three companions had come to a cottage at the lake about midnight and Miss Kocis expressed a desire to go in swimming and finally persuaded one of her friends to go with her. They waded out beyond their depth and as neither were good swimmers, the girl sank before aid could be given.

Deputy Wiley Coe was called and the body was recovered immediately and turned over to Coroner Dewey Kimball.

The body of George Burke, 34 years old, 2639 Rochester Ave., Detroit, was found about 3 p. m. Sunday, floating near the dock at Walled Lake Amusement Park. He had come to the Lake with his wife and son, but was swimming alone when he overcame and was not discovered for several minutes. Coroner Kimball said he believed death was caused by heart disease.
