ANNUAL MEETING SCHOOL DIST. NO. 8.

Meeting called to order at 8:30 p. m. by Chairman Atkinson. Secretary Mairs read proceedings of last Annual Meeting and was approved on motion of D. Leavenworth, supported by Ford Brooks. Treasurer Mairs read financial report and was approved. Chairman Atkinson commented on some portions of the report and the proposed budget. The question of number of months to be taught was left for the Board to decide. Chairman then called for nominations for one trustee for full term, appointing F. D. Clark, F. C. Rice and Erwin Martin, tellers. W. D. Flint and M. Moeren nominated. Flint receiving 17, Moeren 15; Flint declared elected. The Chair again called for nominations for one Trustee for full term. Ford Brooks, Charles Holmes and F. D. Clark nominated, Clark withdrawing. Brooks receiving 19, Holmes 15; Brooks being declared elected.

Question of amount District pay for tuition was taken up. Motion by Clark, supported by Shinn that the maximum amount be \$60.00 per year be paid. Carried.
