



## Fish Kill Caused By Print Shop

A group of ecologists from Birmingham believe they have discovered the cause of a fish kill at the Orchard Ridge campus of Oakland Community College in Farmington Township.

Life Sciences, Inc., a group of doctors interested in ecology, began investigating when dead fish was discovered Nov. 4 in a 14-acre pond on the campus.

They trace the cause to a chemical used in developing printing plates which is believed to have been dumped into the pond from the college print shop.

Farmington Township officials are concerned because water from the retention pond drains into a stream which flows through Springland subdivision, located on the east side of Orchard Lake Rd. across from the campus.

Life Sciences, Inc. had made an earlier appearance in Farmington when the City of Farmington announced plans to clean the Rouge River within city limits.

The doctors then warned of health dangers to workers wading in the Rouge and worked with city officials in sampling waters of the Rouge and in taking preventive measures to avoid problems.

### C'ville Sells Building Bonds

It won't be long before the Edgewood learning center building gets under way at Clarenceville Schools. The \$1 million construction program, which was authorized by the district voters June 14, got formally under way last week when the Clarenceville Board of Education unanimously voted to sell \$1 million worth of bonds to the First of Michigan Corp. lowest of four bidders with its bid of 5.61 per cent interest rate over 26 years.

Working drawings of the high school shop addition and the Edgewood learning center have been prepared, and bidding may start soon on those projects, according to Supt. David B. McDowell.

Those two projects are part of the first phase of the building program which will cost more than \$500,000. The school board has not yet formally determined what projects would be included in the second half, although several proposals have been discussed.
