## Gillotte Is Candidate For County Prosecutor

Thomas P. Gillotte, who is a Republican candidate for county prosecutor in the September primaries, is a practicing attorney in Pontiac, a graduate of Pontiac high school in 1923 and of the Detroit College of Law in 1927. He served as assistant prosecutor in 1929.

Mr. Gillotte is chairman of the Depositors' committee of the Pontiac Commercial Saving Bank, and attorney for Pontiac police and fireman, who are members of the Metropolitan club.

Among his outstanding activities as an attorney he lists the institution of a "suit against Bloomfield Township to protest a road vendor from being forced off the highway and onto the welfare," and the bringing on of an "injunction action against a finance company for excessive charges against a laboring man."

## Civil War Vet Gets Setback By Thieves

W. H. Wieand, of Coldwater and well-known in Farmington, went to war 72 years ago next month. Saturday thieves robbed him of one of his most cherished distinctions.

Mr. Wieand, 89 years old, in his own words, has been "considerably puffed up" over being publicized as the only Union Soldier in Michigan who drives his own automobile.

But Saturday he was afraid he would have to forego his driving. The spirit was willing, but his Model T wouldn't go on three wheels.

Thieves, he explained bitterly, stole the front wheel, a spare tire and then added the crowning touch by stealing all the gasoline from the tank.

Mr. Wieand served under Governor Moses Wisner with the 22nd Michigan infantry.

## Mole Cricket Is Not Considered Harmful

The mole cricket, a rather common Michigan insect, is causing considerable alarm in the State but the entomology department at Michigan State College says this creature is not harmful except in rare cases when it damages root crops or potatoes on muck soils.

This cricket is fairly plentiful but is seldom seen in ordinary places because it burrows in the ground and appears above the surface only at night. One man who sent a specimen to the College said that it had a neck like a mud turtle, claws like a crab, wings like a grasshopper, and a tail like a pheasant.

## WARNING IS SOUNDED AGAINST FIELD FIRES

Beware of field fires, urges the Department of Conservation. Even in areas without extensive timber stands they are potentially destructive.

The practice of permitting field fires to "burn out" in farming districts of southern Michigan during drought periods is often fraught with danger. At the present time weeks of infrequent rain and record high temperatures have dried soil and muck areas. A muck fire may smoulder for days and then spread to farm buildings, causing heavy damage. Take no chances with fire in the open, advises the department. Put it out before it can become destructive.

## PLANT 150,000 ACRES WITH PINE SEEDLINGS

Nearly 150,000 acres of land in Michigan's state forests have been planted to jack, Norway and white pine seedling and transplants from the state forest nursery at Higgins Lake, according to a report of the Department of Conservation.

Reforestation in the state during the past two decades has kept pace with other phases of conservation activity, the report of the Division shows.

## New Information Service Available To Visitors to Nation's Capital

Visitors to Washington now have at their disposal complete information service by which they can learn how to reach any government bureau or department or place of interest about the Nation's Capital. A call to District 4030 connects the great American public with USIS, meaning the United States Information Service, with headquarters in the Commercial National Bank Building at Fourteenth and G Streets, N. W.

Miss Harriet Root, chief of the Information Service, and a group of young women at individual desks equipped with telephones, card files, loose leaf binders and other extensive data will answer requests for information regarding governmental activities or other facts. In the short time that this bureau has been in operation there have been many daily visits, letters, and telephone calls.

The private branch exchange switchboard operated by the bureau is connected by trunk lines with Washington central offices and by tie lines with government bureaus and departments. Government officials estimate that the popularity of this bureau will increase steadily, with the result that in the next few months much more space and greater communication facilities will be necessary.

Prior to the establishment of this bureau, there was no general government department giving out such information.
