Temp! Those Languid Appetites
Handsome as is handsome does, and when a meal tastes as good as it looks you've served both Soul and Stomach—and beautified your table too.

Contrast in color, texture and taste, a bit of imagination and daintiness make the difference between dining and merely eating. It is heartening to see the table look

pretty. Besides, it's fun to prepare a party menu like this:
Summer Party Menu
"Cantaloupe Rings with Melon Balls."
Tiny Veal or Chicken Croquettes.
Creamed Lima Beans and Fresh Corn.
Hot Rolls—Jelly.
"Peppermint Candy, Ice Cream, Iced Tea."
"Cantaloupe Rings With Melon Balls."

On individual serving plates, place inch-wide circles of bright-hued, chilled and peeled cantaloupe. Place a mixture of 6 to 8 alls consisting of cantaloupe, honeydew and watermelon in the center of each circle. Sprinkle each serving with 2 teaspoons lemon juice and a sprinkling of powdered sugar and salt. Garnish with sprigs of mint and serve as an appetizer or as a dessert. If in season, large Bing cherries may also be mixed with the melon balls.

1 quart milk, scalded.
1 lb. red and white striped peppermint candy.
3 tablespoons flour.
3/4 teaspoon salt.

Dissolve the crushed candy in the hot milk. Mix the flour, salt, cold milk, and egg. Slowly pour the hot milk and cook, stirring constantly, until the mixture thickens. Continue cooking for 15 minutes, stirring occasionally. Cool and add the cream. Freeze in 8 parts ice to 1 part salt. Yield, 3/2 gallon.

A Tip On Apples
You may have that apple a day in one of a hundred healthful ways. The average business woman doesn't have time to worry about peeling, coring and cooking apples to convert into apple sauce. She uses the year 'round simple and easy way that we might well follow, especially in these torrid days—Buy canned apple sauce and has it always ready to be served "as is" or in luscious desserts like these:

Ice Box Pudding
1 1/2 cups canned apple sauce.
1/4 cup brown sugar.
1/8 teaspoon salt.
20 gramam crackers, coarsely crumbled.
Whipped cream or Marshmallow cream.
Add the brown sugar and salt to the apple sauce. Beat together. Cool and add the crackers. Pour into a pudding dish. Chill for 2 or 3 hours. Serve with whipped cream or marshmallow cream.

Apple Sauce Turnovers
1 1/2 cups canned apple sauce.
1 1/2 teaspoons cinnamon or nutmeg.
2 cups sifted flour.
2-3 cup shortening.
1/2 teaspoon salt.
1/4 teaspoon baking powder.
1-3 cup cold water.

Mix and sift the flour, salt and baking powder. Cut in the shortening lightly. Add just enough ice water to hold flour and shortening together. Chill. Roll out as for pastry. Cut into four-inch squares. The squares are to be folded diagonally. Place two table-spoons of apple sauce mixed with the spices, if used, on one-half of each square. Moisten the edges and fold the pastry over the filling. Press the edges together and use a fork to prick the tops of the turnovers in several places. Place in a shallow pan and bake in a hot oven (450° F.) for 15 minutes.

By preparing the dough ahead of time and placing it in the ice box, and by using canned apple sauce, these old favorites can be made in a jiffy.

Caught Knapping
Odd that the natives of West Africa and the East Indies should have to learn upon the small Suffolk town of Brandon to supply them with flints for firing their old-fashioned rifles. But Brandon is the only place in the world where flint-knapping is still carried on. The six knappers, only remaining representatives of the craft, can be seen at work in little wooden sheds, probably on the same spot where thousands of years ago Ancient Britons knapped the flints into sling stones, arrow, spear, and axe heads. Flint-knapping entails three distinct processes. First the rough flints, as dug from nearby pits, are quarried. They are then faked into 8-inch strips and then cut into the desired shape. The flints are knapped into four sizes for fitting into the locks of muskets, carbines, horse pistols, and pocket pistols. They are shipped in barrels of 5,000.—*TR-BUS Magazine.*

How Dust Storms Start
Dust storms are generated by the same air mechanics that build the beautiful feecy cumulus clouds of the middle strata of the atmosphere. So once Service explains. When the sun has been shining strongly on the earth for some time, a considerable mass of air is warmed, and since warm air is less dense than cold it begins to rise, sometimes nearly vertically. If there is plenty of moisture in the soil and vegetation, these rising air currents carry up water vapor, which on cooling in the upper levels condenses into clouds. If, however, there has been a drought of several weeks' duration, as frequently happens in the West in late autumn and early spring a dust storm results.
