MICHIGAN STATE WILL BROADCAST FOOTBALL GAMES

East Lansing, Oct. 7.—Michigan State College football will be on the air this fall, WKAR, the broadcasting station of the college, has completed arrangements whereby the play by play report of all games on the "Spartan" schedule will be brought to followers of the Green and White.

The Athletic Council at Michigan State has cooperated with officials of WKAR to make the football broadcast complete, in every detail. Special facilities have been provided which will enable the station to bring to listeners the full thrill of the play as it progresses. A specially constructed broadcasting booth has been constructed in the press box overlooking the playing field, where the announcers can observe the action. In addition, microphones will be installed on the field to relay cheers and the music of the MSC band. Arrangements have also been completed which will provide a similar service when the team is away from home.

The complete schedule to be broadcast includes games with Carnegie Tech on October 13, Manhattan College on October 20, Marquette on November 3, Syracuse on November 10, University of Detroit on November 17, University of Kansas on November 24, and Texas A & M on December 8. The broadcasts will begin at 1:45 p. m. and continue throughout the games.

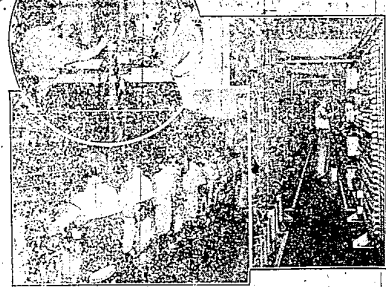

Department of Agriculture Answers Thousands of Calls for Information

Interest in agricultural pursuits increased in more than 4,000,000 place calls being made through the private branch exchange switchboard serving the Department of Agriculture in Washington during the past year ending June 30, 1934. This department, with its 10,676 employees, is served by approximately 3,000 telephones.

Without the modern quick-dialing telephones, the emergency activities of the U. S. Department of Agriculture would have been immeasurably slowed down, according to J. L. Koehl, in charge of telephones and telegraph. More than half of this vast volume of calls—4,200,000—were made within the offices of the department, which is an indication that it is a pretty busy place even without the telephone calls from the outside.

The number of incoming calls is nearly double those outgoing, the approximate figures being 4,211,000 as compared to 2,121,000. This, Koehl believes, is partly because of the thousands of requests for information which the department acts by telephone.

All Sorts of Questions
Formerly to know if firecrackers in refuse will be injurious to life. A hunter calls the Biological Survey to ask about the new regulations on duck hunting. A housewife calls to ask about "some queer white bugs" in her kitchen and is referred to the Bureau of Entomology.

A householder having trouble with his well is asked to talk to an agricultural engineer. A bride finds difficulties in meeting kitchen problems and calls the Bureau of Home Economics for assistance. And people without number call the Weather Bureau, especially when it's too hot or too cold or too dry or too wet.

But within the department there is always much need for quick exchange of information. Science or economic research, impersonal as it may be in reports, is an intensely personal activity. An intricate investigation may require quick information from half a dozen men, each an authority in his own field, and the telephone is used.

Economists and statisticians, even more than laboratory scientists, depend on the telephone. It is of great importance to administrators of all department activities and to those who gather and distribute information on the current agricultural work.

OAKLAND RELIEF AGENCY SEEKS 20 SEWING MACHINES

"The Oakland County Administration must borrow 20 sewing machines immediately, to make cotton sheets, pillow cases and towels," announced S. Skelton today. County Relief Administrator.

"The increased case load, during the past few months and the tremendous demand for sheets and pillow cases together with the reduced relief funds available from the Federal and State government, leads us to appeal to the citizens of Oakland county to loan us a sufficient number of sewing machines to meet the needs.

"We will only require them for a short period and while we are permitted to make repairs and maintain the machines we are permitted to purchase or rent them," he said.

"I am hoping that the citizens of Oakland county will appreciate the fact that the Federal Administration has assumed practically the entire cost for the Relief work in the county for the past year, and I am appealing to the citizens to help out in this particular emergency.

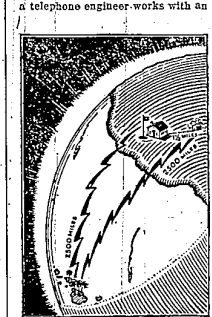
"The Federal Government has supplied us with the material and we have the people to put to work but lack only the machines.

"A survey of the conditions in the county, indicate that the need for sheets and pillow cases is not only general but urgent, as well. I am asking anyone who will loan us sewing machines to phone Mr. Warner, at the Pontiac office, Phone 20108, or write Mr. Warner at the Oakland County Emergency Relief Administration, Oakland and Clark streets, Pontiac, Mich.

Man 1 1/2 Miles Away Cris 5000-Mile Call

The longest way round is sometimes the shortest way home, even for telephone calls. So it proved, at any rate, in the case of a call which traveled 5,000 miles to reach a man who was a mile and a half away from the cross wires.

It seems that about a mile and a half from the Point Reyes radio telephone station near San Francisco, which is the receiving point to connect the Manila-Hawaii radio-telephone circuits to the Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Company, long distance lines, there is a small cabin for making tests. In this cabin a telephone engineer works with an



assortment of testing instruments to check radio signals across the Pacific in order to learn more about atmospheric and magnetic conditions for the benefit of radio-telephone transmission.

For a while after the engineer occupied the cabin, there was no telephone line between the cabin and the receiving station. One day this engineer was in touch by telephone with Honolulu, and the Point Reyes station a mile and a half away was also in touch with Honolulu by telephone. The station had a long distance telephone call for the engineer in the cabin, and requested Honolulu to tell him so. In about half an hour the engineer arrived at the station, in response to a request that had travelled 5,000 miles.
