

Delayed Threshing May Prevent Grain Losses

Excessive rains and high humidity during the present harvest season are apt to cause heavy losses to Michigan grain raisers unless great care is taken in handling the grain before threshing, according to the farm crops department at Michigan State College.

The losses will be in two classes, reduced prices due to excessive moisture content in threshed grain or classes of grain from sprouting in shocks in the field. A bushel of wheat testing 58 pounds must contain not over 14 per cent moisture to grade as No. 2. Discounts from prevailing prices of as much as seven cents a bushel have been made on wheat containing 17 per cent moisture.

Grain which contains too much moisture to bring top prices if threshed now can be stacked or placed in the barn and allowed to cure before it is threshed. Sweating in the stack or now will bring the moisture content of the grain to permissible limits, and the grain can be threshed during dry weather later.

The only treatment possible for grain already threshed is to use plenty of bin space so that the grain is not piled deeply, and to ventilate it by shoveling from one bin to another. One mill has already reported the offering of grain for sale which contained so much moisture that it could not be handled in the mill.
