In Forest Fires

With 12,021 acres of forest burn

with 12.021 acres of forest burned so far this year in comparison
to 46,772 acres burned last year,
the Conservation Department reports a new low record in the number of forest fires as well as the
average burned acreage.

I total of 1.301 fires with on averacre of less than 10 acres each
burned over. The total catimatel
acreage burned is 12,021, Hoth of
these totals for the period of the
tyear they represent are the lowest
on record in Michigan.

A total of 10,000 acres of state land, lying to inte forces areas in the upper as well as the lower peniosals of the state, will be planted by CCC enrollers.


