CHEVROLET DEALER DOUBLES EARLY NOVEMBER SALES

Countrywide sales by Chevrolet dealers for the first 10 days of November totaled 32,657 units, hearly double the highest total for the same period in previous years, it was announced by Chevrolet Motor Co. The total reflects the results of the early introduction joi 1936 models and the change of date of the automobile show season, says the announcement.

The total of 32,557 not only exceeds the record of any privious corresponding period; but sets mew high mark for 10-days' sales following the introduction dist of any previous new models, in the sald.

"It is apparent that the early presentation of new models, and the holding of the automobile show in November instead of Jahuary, has had an important effect on seasonal sales," commented W. E.

seasonal sales," commented W. E. Holler, rice president and general sales manager, who announced the new records. "This first thenday period of November included ode you which the new Chevrolets were not on sale, since they were not shown to the public till November 2, yet its sales exceed the total 30-day November sales of all but four years in the history of the company. Our largest November record was in 1926, and they sales in the first ten days of that month were 17,678 units, only slightly more than half of the new record just established."

CHICAGO MARKET DETERMINES STATE MILK PRICES

MILK PRICES

During two past year and sometime previous to that, all mill produced by the state farmers for the dull, many the state farmers for the dull, and the state of the dull can be according to the Cheago butter market. Up to the present time, 42 per cent of the milk slipped by the nearly 14,000 producers of the Michigan Milk Producers association, in the Detroit market, is in class II and III. The prife for this milk is determined by the Chicago butter market plus certain percentages. Chicago 22-core butter last month averaged 25-f. cents per pound, which is half ceft per pound higher than a year pound the producer of the state of the producer with that sates period a year ago. This is no doubt due to there being less dairy cows on farms this year, compared with a year ago, even though pasture conditions have been considerably improved this year.

The cold storage bidding this year are 23,619,000 pounds larger than a year ago. During this same period 21,825,825 pounds of butter has been imported into this vountry, while only 50,983 in jounds was exported.
