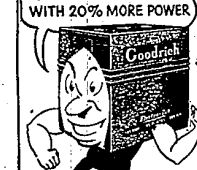

TELEPHONE SERVICE GOES

ALONG AS HOUSE IS MOVED

When a two-story frame house was moved the entire length of a city block in Washington, D. C., not long ago, not only did the occupants remain in the house as usual, but telephone service was maintained for the comfort and convenience of the family during the moving process, which took over four days.

The house was moved from one corner of Blaine Street, N. E., Washington, to the corner at the other end of the block. Continuous telephone service was made possible by connecting one end of a coil of wire with the wire entering the house, and the other end of the coil with the cable terminal. As the house made its slow progress along the street, the wire uncoiled automatically, and when it was settled on its new site, the permanent telephone connections were made with the cable terminal.
