

## NEW STATE FOREST PARKS BUILT IN 1935

Establishment of new state forest parks, camp grounds and picnic grounds, and improvement of many previously in existence, has been one of the important functions of the Michigan Emergency Conservation Work organization in 1935.

In contrast to the policy of establishing state parks at easily accessible locations, the policy has been to locate forest parks and camp and picnic grounds far from the traveled highways to the isolation of forests and wilderness. Natural surroundings are disturbed as little as possible.

Trails must be constructed, however to provide access for the hunters, fishermen and woods lovers who are the principal patrons of the parks and camps. The camp area is then cleared of brush and undergrowth. Stove bases of concrete are poured, and cast steel stoves are placed. Rest rooms are constructed and wells provided where necessary. Guard rails and bumper rails are also constructed if required. A camp register is provided at all sites, in a suitable receptacle. At those sites where landscaping is necessary trees are planted and seedling trees are planted.
