# Schools Introduce Five New Vo-Ed Classes

Five new vocational education courses will be offered in Farmington High schools next fall, under curriculum changes approved Monday by the Board of Education.  
Vocational welding, machine shop and drafting as well as nursing arts and graphic arts will be offered, according to a plan submitted by Earl Baumunk, director of vocational education.  
Baumunk said that a placement system will be in operation by the end of the 1969-70 school year to help all vocational education students find post-high school jobs and training.

THE NEW courses are designed for students interested in becoming employable in the respective areas at the beginning level, Baumunk said.  
Vocational welding will include arc, acetylene, resistance and tungsten inert gas welding. A general metals course is required to begin instruction.  
Vocational machine shop will prepare the student as an oper-

ator of single or multiple-phase machines and includes layout, operation, sequences, welding and machine repair.  
Vocational drafting will be involved with jig and fixture design. It will be a two-hour course (taught for two semesters). It requires two preliminary drafting courses.  
NURSING ARTS will be part of the cooperative occupational education program and will include a survey of basic nursing procedures as well as a more complete study of foods and nutrition, patient care and other areas.  
Baumunk said that the graphic arts program has not been outlined in detail, but that it would include work in printing and photography.  
The five new courses will be taught in Farmington High School, North Farmington students will be bussed to FHS for those classes, Baumunk said.  
Equipment required by the new classes will not effect the current budget, because expenditures have been planned into the budget since 1967, Baumunk said.

The electronics sequence now offered at North Farmington High School will be offered at Farmington next year, he said.
