### Van Wagoner's 'No' Takes Oakland County Man Out of Governor Race

Likelihood of Oakland County having a candidate in the field for the governorship this year has been eliminated with the refusal of State Highway Commissioner Murray D. ("Pat") Van Wagoner to accept suggestions that he run for the Democratic nomination for governor.

Mr. Van Wagoner has been urged to seek the executive chair although his term as head of the highway department does not expire until spring of 1937. The highway commissioner started up the ladder in politics toward his present high position by winning the drain commissioner'ship in Oakland County in 1930, being the first Democratic official elected to a county office in a quarter of a century. His work as drain commissioner attracted sufficient attention to win him the nomination by the Democratic State convention in 1933, and he went on to win the election which followed.

Mr. Van Wagoner's statement, which has served to clarify the atmosphere concerning candidates for the governorship is as follows: For sometime the unsolicited suggestion has been made from a variety of sources that I declare myself a candidate for the Democratic nomination for governor.

This invitation to enter the gubernatorial race has come from close personal friends, from independent progressives of both major parties. Newspapers of the state have been generous in their interpretation of whatever sentiment has been expressed in my behalf.

I would be a human indeed to be insensitive to this generous expression of friendship and confidence. Believing that this expression has been prompted by a sincerity of purpose, I have given the matter my thorough consideration. And, at this time, rather than lend myself to any confusion in the councils of my party or in the minds of the people of this state, I am convinced that my position should be clarified once and for all.

No one can dismiss with a mere shrug of the shoulder an invitation from an appreciable section of the voters that he become a candidate for the high office of governor. There is something about such an invitation which causes one to make a thorough analysis of one's qualifications and to become most humble in this self-analysis.

In arriving at a decision as to my proper course, it appeared advisable to determine in what capacity I can be of the greatest amount of service to the people of the state.

In less than three years of my administration as state highway commissioner approximately \$54,000,000 worth of Federal highway improvements have been authorized in Michigan through the agency of the state highway department. During the approaching construction season we anticipate \$30,000,000 worth of highway improvements will be completed, the largest construction program in a single year in the entire history of the state.

There are pending in Congress at this time two measures of great interest to the state highway department which I have actively supported in Washington. One would make the Federal Aid program for the fiscal year available this July. Under it Michigan would have a \$7,600,000 construction program. The other provides for a continuation of Federal Aid on the present basis for the fiscal years of 1938 and 1939 and certain other forms of highway relief appropriations. Under this measure Michigan would have a two-year construction program approximating \$21,000,000.

In addition, we are now engaged in the most comprehensive highway safety and traffic survey ever undertaken by the state highway department. These studies, from which we expect to obtain information which will influence highway programs and policies for twenty years, are far from completed.

The foregoing is indicative of the tremendous responsibilities upon the state highway commissioner this year. It is apparent that the job of the present commissioner is far from finished.

Realizing all the responsibilities of the present and in the future attached to my present office, my duty is made clear. The people of Michigan elected me as their state highway commissioner for four years fully expecting that I would give the job my everyday best efforts for four years. To run for governor without resigning as state highway commissioner would be to cheat the taxpayers. To resign and enter the race for governor would be a surrender of the responsibilities I undertook to fulfill in 1933.

I, therefore, say to my friends, party leaders, and other well-wishers that I am not, nor will I permit myself to be, a candidate for the Democratic nomination for governor. This action is final and without qualification.

### ALLOWING DOGS TO MOLEST GAME IS SERIOUS OFFENSE

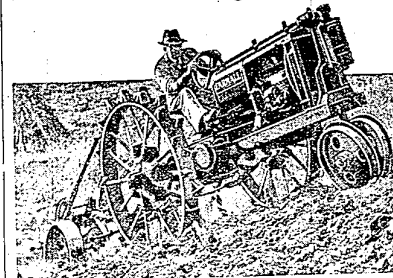
Dog owners who permit their dogs to molest and harass protected game birds and animals during closed season are liable to arrest and fine in justice court.
