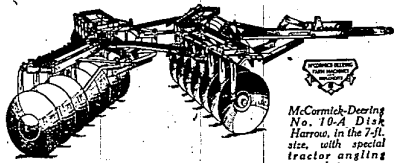


A New Light Tractor Disk Harrow

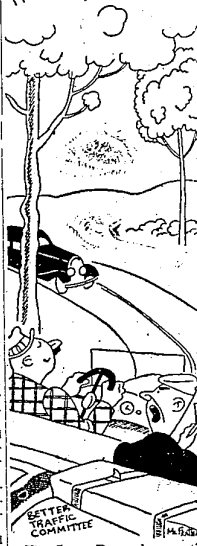

Homemaker Corner

"If children under two years of age want to eat with their fingers let them do it."

That is the advice of Mary Lewis, instructor in home management at Michigan State College, East Lansing, who believes that most parents apply the wrong psychology in bringing up their children.

"Learning to handle a spoon is a more complex process than when fingers are used," she says. "The child likes to do things as older children in the family do, so you need not fear his use of his hands in the early stages of feeding himself."

The sensations of satisfaction and expectancy can be harnessed to good advantage in developing good eating habits for children under two, she says. Satisfaction in pouring milk from a pitcher into his cup or placing additional helpings of food on his own plate aids eating habits when small portions are given at the start.

Avoid Issues

Avoid issues before, during and after the meal. But hand out praise for little things at the dinner table, to create a feeling of expectancy for mealtime which is most desirable, she says.

Miss Lewis believes that any normal two year old who has been properly trained should be able to feed himself any meal in 30 to 45 minutes. She says parents can judge when to begin teaching good habits by the first appearance of bad habits.

BENEFICIARIES WRITE THANKS TO NEW COMPANY

Payment of death claims on policies of the old Detroit Life Insurance Company within a few weeks of the organizing of The Life Insurance Company of Detroit is bringing quick and grateful acknowledgment from beneficiaries, President Thomas F. Lawrence said today.

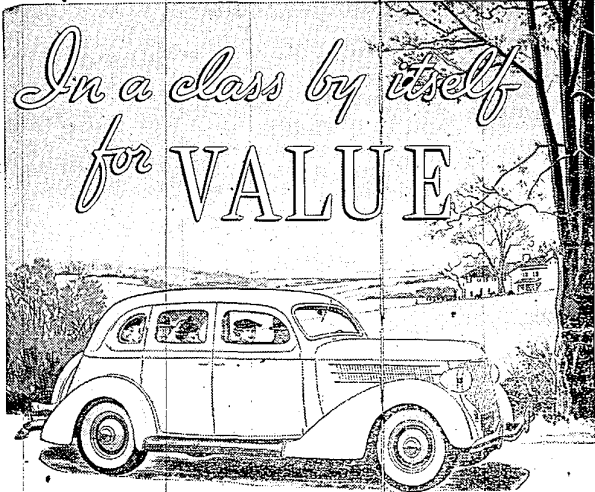
