MANY DEVELOPMENTS IN TELEPHONE SERVICE WERE ACCOMPLISHED DURING THE PAST YEAR

Conference Calls, Longer Reduced Rate Period, Further Overseas Service, Extended in 1935

The year 1935 was one of much accomplishment in the Bell Telephone System. Fittingly so, since 1935 marked the fiftieth anniversary of the incorporation of the American Telephone and Telegraph Company, headquarters organization of the Bell System.

During 1935, the number of Bell telephones in service increased 466,000. This is the largest gain above its any year since 1929. The average daily number of telephone calls during the year increased 4.1 per cent for local calls and 4.6 per cent for toll and long distance calls. Consistent improvement was made in the standards of telephone service, and development and research work brought important results.

A Half-Century Anniversary

It was on February 28, 1885, that the American Telephone and Telegraph Company received its certificate of incorporation, pledging it to develop the then infant telephone system to the point that communication would become possible between the cities and towns of this country. . . and also by cable and other appropriate means with the rest of the known world. This anniversary was appropriately celebrated on February 28, 1935.

Another important event of the year occurred on April 25, 1935, when voices circled the world in two-way conversation for the first time. Telephone officials in New York office, seated fifty feet apart, talked with each other over 23,000 miles of wire and radio circuits. Their words made the trip around the world in about a quarter of a second.

Three days later, on April 28, 1935, a new type of telephone call was featured in a Bell System radio broadcast when six celebrities, in widely separated cities, talked together by telephone as freely as though they were seated around a table. A multi-telephone hook-up, recently developed, permitted each to have his say and to hear what the others said. This new type of call is known as a conference call, and one of the year's developments was the growing use made of this new service for both business and social calls.

Night-rate Period Was Advanced

On June 1, 1935, reduced long distance night rates were advanced so as to begin at 7 P. M., instead of 8:30 P. M. as formerly. Late in the year, tariffs were filed which became effective on January 15, 1936, establishing reduced night rates on person-to-person long distance calls and reduced rates all day Sunday on both station-to-station and person-to-person long distance calls.

In 1935, two additional countries in the Caribbean area—the Dominican Republic and Honduras—were brought within reach of telephones in the United States, and the overseas telephone service was also extended to include Paraguay, South America, and Iceland. Thus, at the end of 1935, about 93 per cent of the world's telephones were within reach of any Bell System or Bell-connecting telephone.

Other developments of the year included the equipment of the original long wave radio circuit between New York and London with an improved 5-band privacy system, designed still further to enhance the privacy of two-way radio telephony; the production of a new molybdenum-permalloy alloy; the development of a lead calcium battery alloy; and the granting of over 300 patents, covering new developments in the telephone art, to the Bell Telephone Laboratories.


