July 30 Deadline For Spraying Apple Trees

Apple growers in Oakland Coun-y are advised to complete the first aying for the second generation July 30 in order to catch the cod-ling moth larvae at hatching time to prevent fruit damage.

Two types of spray are advised by Ray Hutson of the entomology department at Michigan State College, For those who intend to washruit with chemicals, the spray should consist of three pounds of lead arsenate and four to six pounds of hydrated lime in no entomology. yeau arsenate and four to six-pounds of hydrated lime in 100 gal-lons of water ns of water.

Growers not equipped to wash fruit with chemicals are advised to use a summer oil emulsion, three quarts plus three-fourths pint of 40 cent nicotene sulphate in gallons of water, not combined with lime sulphur, other sulphur
