COLD OR HOT?

IT'S a little tube about half the size of a steel knitting needle and about as round. It influences our behavior, our market, our clothes and our comfort. It's a thermom-

Back in 1602, there was a protessor of mathematics at the University of Pedun named Galileo. He was fond of pattering with tubes and acids. Being Greek, he christened one brine child that he fash-loned "thernios" for warm and "interer for measure, it was a glass tube that was set in colored water, Galileo could hold the air bulb in his hand and find a measure of beat from his own budy.

Up to 1640, however, there was no agreement as to what scale should he used on the fascinating instrument. Back in 1592, there was a profes

In 1714 Fahrenhelt of Danzig evolved a scale, using the interval of 180 degrees. The freezing point of water was given as 32 degrees and the bolling point at 212 de-

grees.
This is the only invention that has such a background of universal co-operation from scientists of all

Celsius proposed a scale in 1742 Ceisiis proposed a senie in 1124 with a freezing point of water at 100 degrees and a bolling point at zero. These degrees were reversed some time later by Christin of Lyons and became the centigrade scale. It's in tremendous trille—that little glass tube!
