Botsford Expansion Underway

Construction of a 100-bed addition to Botsford General Hospital in Farmington Township is holding to target and the new wing should be ready for occupancy by June 1972, according to Administrator Seymour Kantor.

Opening of the new three-story structure will
mean an additional 240 jobs, Kantor said. Including
part-time help, additional employment should total an
equivalent of 230 full time employes.
The wing, which will cost an estimated \$6

million for building and equipment, is now almost completely enclosed, Kantor said.

The three story tower, of sand colored brick matching the main building, allows for construction of an additional three stories at its top, for an eventu-

al six story structure.

It will include the latest in technological equipment, Kantor said.
