Judy Collins Heads Festival Attractions

The fifth week of the 1971 Meadow Brook Music Festival begins Wednesday, July 21, with the haunting artistry of folksinger Judy Collins. Miss Collins will be the fourth performer in this season's highly successful folk-rock series.

On Thursday, July 22, the young Israeli violinist Pinchas Zukerman will perform with the Detroit Symphony Orchestra under Sixten Ehrling in Lalo's "Symphonie Espagnole." Friday evening's jazz concert features two of the jazz world's major talents, Thelonious Monk, inventor of "Bop," and Anita O'Day "Queen of Scat." Rounding

out the session will be the Newport Festival All Stars, a stand-out, old-fashioned jazz group made up of the stellar regulars from the famed Rhode Island Festival.

Saturday, July 24, Zukerman returns to the violin in the second Violin Concerto, again with the Detroit Symphony under Ehrling. Skitch Henderson makes his second Meadow Brook appearance this summer in Sunday's Pops Concert, July 25, at 6:30 p.m., this time both as pianist and conductor, in a program highlighted by excerpts from hit Broadway musicals.

"How To Succeed in Business Without Really Trying" is the Dearborn Recreation Department Summer Musical Workshop's next production at the new Ford Woods Ice Arena, Ford Road and Mead, Dearborn.

Show dates are July 23, 24, 30 and 31, at 8:30 p.m. Admission is \$1.

One-Man Show Is July 24, 25

DETROIT "An Evening of Mime," a one-man show by guest artist-residence, Geoffrey Buckley, will be presented in Theatre 113 on Saturday and Sunday, July 24 and 25. The theatre is located at the University of Detroit, 4001 W. McNichols, and the performance is sponsored by the U-D Department for the Performing Arts in conjunction with its second annual summer school.

Instructor of the school's two mime workshops, Buckley has studied at studios in London and Paris and has been tutor to many of England's finest theatre companies.

His performances will begin at 8:30 p.m. Tickets are available at the U-D.

Christine Hennessy, prima ballerina of the Royal Winnipeg Ballet will be in residence at the summer school Aug. 9 through 13. She will teach five master classes during the week at Marygrove College's Alumnae Hall.

Continuing through July is Theatre 113's production of "Tales from 100 Aker Wood," a new musical version of A. A. Milne's "Winnie the Pooh," which has been adapted by James W. Rodgers. Performances are held weekends on Friday, at 7:30 p.m. and Saturdays at 11 a.m. and 2 p.m. Tickets are \$1.25, with group rates available.

The month of August will bring two new studio productions which will be staged in the university's experimental theatre facility, Stage II, located at Livernois and Florence, across from the campus.

Nine Michigan State University faculty members are among 110 China scholars from throughout the country who have signed a policy statement calling for the admission of Red China into the United Nations.

The statement appeared in the form of an ad in a recent issue of the New York Times.

Mary Norris, and Detroit Symphony cellist, Mario DiFiore, comprise this outstanding professional ensemble, which spends about six weeks each year touring the U.S. This year they will visit St. Louis and Washington, D.C., among others.

The Tiptons will be coming from the Aspen Summer Festival Music School where they both teach. DiFiore is on the faculty of the Schoolcraft Summer Music School.

Their recital will comprise works of American composers, in keeping with the festive theme, as well as works by Rameau, Bach and Martinu.

ON THE PROGRAM will be "Pieces de Clavier en Concert" by Rameau; Sonata No. 4 in C Major for Flute and Continuo, S. 1033, by Bach; Trio for Flute, Cello and Piano, by Martinu; Four Preludes for Piano by Gould; Capriccio for Cello and Piano by Foss; Three Bagatelles for Flute and Cello, by Haieff; and Trio for Flute, Cello and Piano by Rorem.
